From the Library Director

The sun is shining and our library is open for in-person browsing and borrowing. Plans are underway to expand our open hours and to host some exciting new events and programs in the coming months.

As part of a region-wide initiative of the Mid-Hudson Library System, we received a \$3,000 grant from the American Library Association and Small & Rural Libraries to conduct a series of six community conversations. Designed to help us better understand the aspirations of our town, these discussions will elicit people's views of the future, concerns about the present, and ideas about strengthening our town. The goal is to become more effective in serving Claverack. Please check the calendar on our website for meeting dates or call the library to learn more.
